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Required Communications

Generally accepted auditing standards (AU-C 260, *The Auditor's Communication With Those Charged With Governance*) require the auditor to promote effective two-way communication between the auditor and those charged with governance. Consistent with this requirement, the following summarizes our responsibilities regarding the financial statement audit, as well as observations arising from our audit that are significant and relevant to your responsibility to oversee the financial and related compliance reporting process.

Our Responsibilities With Regard to the Financial Statement Audit	Our responsibilities under auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and <i>Government Auditing Standards</i> issued by the Comptroller General of the United States have been described to you in our arrangement letter dated June 4, 2019. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve management or those charged with governance of their responsibilities, which are also described in that letter.
Overview of the Planned Scope and Timing of the Financial Statement Audit	<p>We have issued a separate communication, dated June 4, 2019, addressed to Mr. Paul Ballard, CEO of Texas Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company, regarding the planned scope and timing of our audit and have discussed with him our identification of significant risks of material misstatement.</p> <p>As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the financial statements present only the TexPool investment trust fund and do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Texas as of August 31, 2019, and the changes in its financial position for the year then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion was not modified with respect to this matter.</p>
Accounting Policies and Practices	<p>Preferability of Accounting Policies and Practices Under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, in certain circumstances, management may select among alternative accounting practices. In our view, in such circumstances, management has selected the preferable accounting practice.</p> <p>Adoption of, or Change in, Accounting Policies Management has the ultimate responsibility for the appropriateness of the accounting policies used by TexPool. A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by TexPool is included in Note 1 to the financial statements. There has been no initial selection of accounting policies and no changes in significant accounting policies or their application during the year ended August 31, 2019.</p> <p>Significant or Unusual Transactions We did not identify any significant or unusual transactions or significant accounting policies in controversial or emerging areas for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.</p>

Audit Adjustments	There were no audit adjustments made to the original trial balance presented to us to begin our audit.
Uncorrected Misstatements	We are not aware of any uncorrected misstatements other than misstatements that are clearly trivial.
Disagreements With Management	We encountered no disagreements with management over the application of significant accounting principles, the basis for management's judgments on any significant matters, the scope of the audit or significant disclosures to be included in the financial statements.
Consultations With Other Accountants	We are not aware of any consultations management had with other accountants about accounting or auditing matters.
Significant Issues Discussed With Management	No significant issues arising from the audit were discussed or the subject of correspondence with management.
Significant Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit	We did not encounter any significant difficulties in dealing with management during the audit.

Summary of Significant Accounting Estimates

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the preparation of financial statements and are based upon management's current judgment. The process used by management encompasses its knowledge and experience about past and current events, and certain assumptions about future events. Management may wish to monitor throughout the year the process used to determine and record these accounting estimates. The following describes the significant accounting estimates reflected in TexPool's August 31, 2019, financial statements.

Fair Value of Investments	<p>TexPool meets the criteria of Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 79, <i>Certain External Investment Pools and Pool Participants</i>, and as such, measures investments at amortized cost. However, the fair value of investments is required to be disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.</p> <p>Investments are priced daily by the custodian and fair values are compared to carrying values. Because the pool's goal is to maintain a net asset value (NAV) of \$1.00, if the ratio is less than 0.995 or greater than 1.005, TexPool will sell investment securities, as required, to maintain the ratio at a point between 0.995 and 1.005.</p>	<p>The fair value of mutual funds is determined using the NAV as reported by the fund and is classified as Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.</p> <p>Debt securities and repurchase agreements classified as Level 2 of the fair value hierarchy are valued using other observable significant inputs, including but not limited to, quoted prices for similar securities, interest rates and a fixed-income pricing model.</p>	<p>We tested the fair value of the investments by verifying the NAV or fair value with published sources. We concluded the valuation methods and estimates are reasonable.</p>

This representation letter is provided in connection with your audits of the basic financial statements of Texas Local Government Investment Pool (TexPool) as of and for the years ended August 31, 2019 and 2018 for the purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the financial statements are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

We confirm, to the best of our knowledge and belief, that as of the date of this letter:

Financial Statements

1. We have fulfilled our responsibilities, as set out in the terms of the audit arrangement letter dated June 4, 2019, for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements referred to above in accordance with U.S. GAAP.
2. We acknowledge our responsibility for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.
3. We acknowledge our responsibility for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control to prevent and detect fraud.
4. Significant assumptions used by us in making accounting estimates, including those measured at fair value, are reasonable and reflect our judgment based on our knowledge and experience about past and current events, and our assumptions about conditions we expect to exist and courses of action we expect to take.
5. Related-party relationships and transactions have been recorded in accordance with the economic substance of the transaction and appropriately accounted for and disclosed in accordance with the requirements of U.S. GAAP.
6. There have been no events subsequent to the date of the financial statements for which U.S. GAAP requires adjustment or disclosure.
7. There are no effects of known actual or possible litigation and claims to be accounted for and disclosed in accordance with U.S. GAAP.
8. The following have been properly recorded and/or disclosed in the financial statements:
 - a. Net position held in trust for pool participants.
 - b. The fair value of investments.

- c. All significant estimates and investment concentrations exceeding 5% known to management which are required to be disclosed.
 - d. Deposits and investment securities categories of risk.
9. We have no direct or indirect legal or moral obligation for any debt of any organization, public or private.
10. We have complied with all aspects of contractual agreements that would have a material effect on the financial statements in the event of noncompliance. In connection therewith, we specifically represent that we are responsible for determining that we are not subject to the requirements of the Single Audit Act because we have not received, expended or otherwise been the beneficiary of the required amount of federal awards during the period of this audit.
11. We have no knowledge of any uncorrected misstatements in the financial statements.

Information Provided

12. We have provided you with:
- a. Access to all information of which we are aware that is relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements such as records, documentation and other matters;
 - b. Additional information that you have requested from us for the purpose of the audits;
 - c. Unrestricted access to persons within TexPool from whom you determined it necessary to obtain audit evidence; and
 - d. Minutes of the meetings of the governing board and committees, or summaries of actions of recent meetings for which minutes have not yet been prepared.
13. All transactions have been recorded in the accounting records and are reflected in the financial statements.
14. We have disclosed to you the results of our assessment of risk that the financial statements may be materially misstated as a result of fraud.
15. We have no knowledge allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting TexPool's financial statements involving:
- a. Management.
 - b. Employees who have significant roles in internal control.
 - c. Others where the fraud could have a material effect on the financial statements.
16. We have no knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting TexPool's financial statements received in communications from employees, former employees, analysts, regulators, or others.

17. We have no knowledge of noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations affecting TexPool's financial statements.
18. We are not aware of any pending or threatened litigation and claims whose effects should be considered when preparing the financial statements and we have not consulted legal counsel concerning litigation or claims.
19. We have disclosed to you the identity of TexPool's related parties and all the related-party relationships and transactions of which we are aware.
20. We are aware of no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in the design or operation of internal controls that could adversely affect TexPool's ability to record, process, summarize and report financial data.
21. We are aware of no communications from regulatory agencies concerning noncompliance with, or deficiencies in, financial reporting practices.
22. During the course of your audits, you may have accumulated records containing data that should be reflected in our books and records. All such data have been so reflected. Accordingly, copies of such records in your possession are no longer needed by us.
23. The Texas Trust charges a management fee for basic services provided to participants. As of August 31, 2019, the fee was 4.5 basis points. Federated earns 4.0 basis points as their management fee and the Texas Trust earns 0.5 basis points as its administrative fee. There are no other fees associated with operating the pool.

Supplementary Information

24. With respect to Management's Discussion and Analysis as required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board to supplement the basic financial statements:
 - a. We acknowledge our responsibility for the presentation of such required supplementary information.
 - b. We believe such required supplementary information is measured and presented in accordance with guidelines prescribed by U.S. GAAP.
 - c. The methods of measurement or presentation have not changed from those used in the prior period.

Compliance Considerations

In connection with your audit conducted in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we confirm that management:
